Hall Park Academy have invested over £50,000 redeveloping the Post-16 centre, creating new learning environments and specialist resources solely for Sixth Form use.

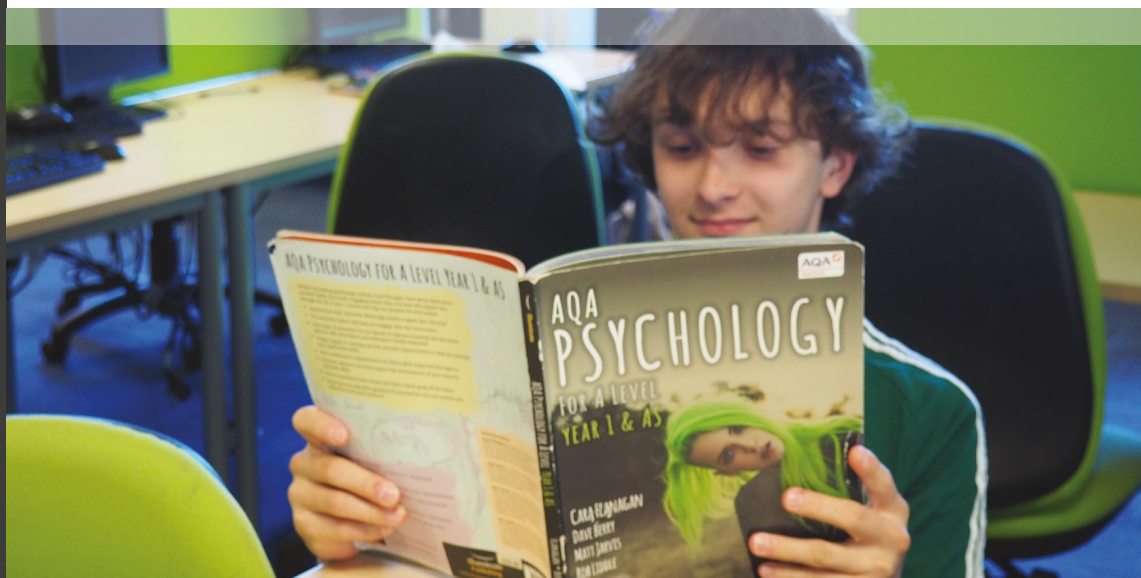

Enrichment and extra-curricular activities

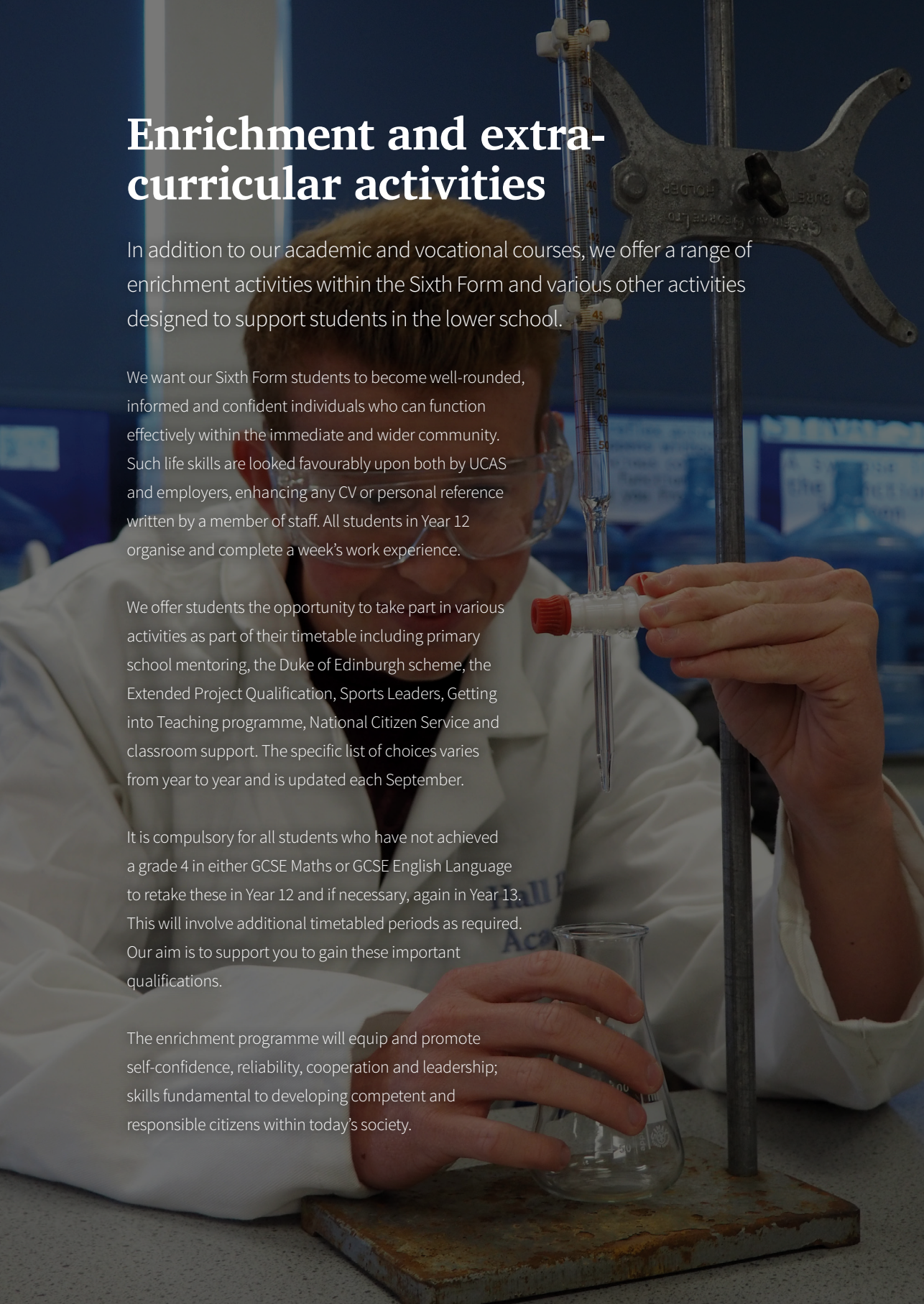
In addition to our academic and vocational courses, we offer a range of enrichment activities within the Sixth Form and various other activities designed to support students in the lower school.

We want our Sixth Form students to become well-rounded, informed and confident individuals who can function effectively within the immediate and wider community. Such life skills are looked favourably upon both by UCAS and employers, enhancing any CV or personal reference written by a member of staff. All students in Year 12 organise and complete a week's work experience.

We offer students the opportunity to take part in various activities as part of their timetable including primary school mentoring, the Duke of Edinburgh scheme, the Extended Project Qualification, Sports Leaders, Getting into Teaching programme, National Citizen Service and classroom support. The specific list of choices varies from year to year and is updated each September.

It is compulsory for all students who have not achieved a grade 4 in either GCSE Maths or GCSE English Language to retake these in Year 12 and if necessary, again in Year 13. This will involve additional timetabled periods as required. Our aim is to support you to gain these important qualifications.

The enrichment programme will equip and promote self-confidence, reliability, cooperation and leadership; skills fundamental to developing competent and responsible citizens within today's society.

Other A Level equivalent qualifications

- Music Performance (BTEC Level 3 National Extended Certificate) *This qualification is the equivalent to 1 A Level.*
- Art and Design (OCR Level 3 Cambridge Technical) *This qualification is available as single or double award, equivalent to 1 or 2 A Levels.*
- IT (OCR Level 3 Cambridge Technical) *This qualification is available as single or double award, equivalent to 1 or 2 A Levels.*
- Health and Social Care (BTEC Level 3 Extended Certificate) *This qualification is available as single or double award, equivalent to 1 or 2 A Levels.*

Where recruitment to a subject is low, decisions about viability will be considered.

2023 Redhill Trust minimum entry requirements for Post-16 study

All students must attain five 9-4 grades at GCSE (or BTEC equivalents) with preferably a grade 5 in either English Language or Mathematics. Individual subjects will require a specific grade in a particular subject at GCSE (see course booklet)

All students will be expected to choose 3 A Levels which they will study for 2 years (the exception being students who study 3 A Levels plus Further Mathematics) Students no longer sit an AS exam at the end of Year 12 but will sit all examinations at the end of Year 13.

All students will be interviewed by a member of the Sixth Form team. This will enable them to make an informed choice about the best subjects to suit their individual needs. Parents are welcome to discuss these choices with the Sixth Form team following the interview.
