 - Almost 50% of university applicants got into a Russell Group university.

Qualifications

All students follow Level 3 courses – A Level or equivalent to A Level such as BTEC

A-Levels have internal exams at the end of Y12 and official exams in Y13

Vocational qualifications have more continuous assessment





Other qualifications

English and Maths GCSE retake

- if students have not achieved grade 4 in English Language or Maths.
- one hour a week taught resit class.
- Students have the opportunity to sit the exam again in the November exam series.
- If not successful there are further opportunities in the summer of year 12 and November and summer of year 13.

<u>Enrichment opportunities</u> – other qualifications may be available in addition to MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses) offered for free from a wide range of higher education institutions.





Non-qualification activity

- Timetabled activity to develop the skills that employers and others expect:
- Tutor time PD, mentoring, enrichment activities, weekly attendance checks with form tutor, careers and Higher Education guidance.
- Enrichment DoE, Sports Leaders, mentoring, Art, work experience, charity and voluntary work, lesson support, music, drama
- Student leadership Sixth Form Committee, sports clubs, sports coaching, music, drama, school trips
- Non-contact periods and Study periods are not free periods!

- Complete all homework by the deadline
- Engage fully and participate
- Review the lesson and close learning gaps quickly
- Do additional work to read around the subject. This is essential for successful sixth formers.

Free online courses delivered by universities and organisations from all over the world. A great opportunity to learn more about topics you are interested in, to develop subject knowledge or to discover new passions. Usually the courses last up to 6 weeks and require a modest amount of time each week.

Free videos of lectures and talks on a huge variety of topics delivered by experts in their fields. A great way to begin exploring topical issues, subject specific ideas or just to expand your mind. They could also be used to develop presentation or public speaking skills.

Expected hours of study

Timetabled lessons – 4 hours per week
Additional study periods – 4 per week minimum
Set homework – 2/3 hours per subject per week





Hall Park Academy Attendance - target is 96%

Full attendance to lessons is imperative. Timetabled lessons for the foundation for A level success, study outside of lessons supports the application of these lessons.

- Timetabled lessons classrooms
- Timetabled Study Periods Study Centre with directed work from teachers
- Non-contact periods study in school in the Study Centre, or spare classrooms on homework, research, independent work, enrichment or careers preparation.
- Registers in lessons, study periods and fingerprint system







Being successful

- Planned absence students fill in a 'Leave of Absence' form which parents sign. This is for compulsory medical appointments, driving tests, funerals etc.
- Unplanned absence such as illness. Parents are asked to call or email the school to make us aware of the absence each day.
- Holidays in line with government guidelines, holidays cannot be authorised in term time.
- Attendance monitoring: below 96% = concern
- Paid employment 10 hours maximum is expected.





Progression through year 12

- Data checks two points in the year Nov, Jul progress reported to parents
- Parents' evening 5th March 2024
- Internal exams in June give UCAS predicted grades
