As the first term draws to a close, I am writing to give some updates.

Attendance

Despite a strong start to the year, whole-school attendance is slightly lower than we would like it to be; however, the number of students with attendance below 90% is much reduced and better than all schools nationally. This is important because we know the positive impact the good attendance has in achievement. We are grateful for your support in trying to ensure your children attend school as much as possible.

We will be recognising students who have achieved 100% attendance during this term in our end of term assemblies, and students with attendance above 98% for this term are invited to take part in a rewards activity on Thursday 21 December. At the start of next half term, we will be rewarding all students who achieved 100% attendance in half term 2. Your child's year-to-date attendance can be viewed in Class Charts.
